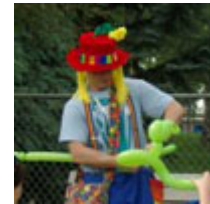

ELECTIONS '13



This is the second in a four-part series of articles dealing with this year's municipal election.

WHAT ARE THE QUALIFICATIONS A PERSON MUST HAVE TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR NOMINATION? A person may be nominated as a candidate if, on *Nomination Day*, the person:

- Is eligible to vote in that election:
- Is at least 18 years old
- Is a Canadian Citizen
- Has resided in Alberta for the 6 consecutive months immediately preceding Election Day and the person's place of residence is located in the area on Election Day
- Is a resident of the municipality for the 6 consecutive months immediately preceding Nomination Day,
- Is not otherwise ineligible or disqualified.

WHEN IS AN INDIVIDUAL INELIGIBLE TO RUN FOR OFFICE? A person is not eligible to run as a candidate if, on *Nomination Day*, the person:

- is the auditor of the municipality,
- is an employee of the municipality,
- is indebted to the municipality for taxes in excess of \$50,
- is indebted to the municipality for any other debt in excess of \$500,
- has, within the previous 10 years, been convicted of an offence under the Local Authorities Election Act, the Election Act or the Canada Elections Act,
- is party to a subsisting contract with the municipality,
- has a pecuniary (money) interest in any subsisting contract with the municipality (NOTE: there are several qualifiers for this rule to give local businessmen an equal opportunity to continue doing business with the municipality and at the same time hold office).

A person can not be nominated for more than one office on Town Council. However, a candidate can

run for Town Council and as a School Board Trustee simultaneously.

HOW IS A PERSON NOMINATED? Nomination Packages will be available at the Town Office. The Nomination Form requires the signatures of at least five eligible electors and must be accepted in writing by the candidate. By signing the acceptance the candidate swears that he/she is eligible to be elected and will accept the office if elected. A deposit of \$100 is required. The deposit will be returned to the candidate if they receive the required number of votes.

WHEN IS NOMINATION DAY AND WHAT HAPPENS ON THAT DAY? Nomination day for the 2013 election will be Monday, September 23rd. On that day, from 10:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon, the Returning Officer will accept nominations, in the Town Office, from eligible candidates for the positions being contested.

WHAT HAPPENS IF THERE ARE ONLY AS MANY NOMINATIONS RECEIVED AS POSITIONS AVAILABLE? The Returning Officer will declare the nominees elected by acclamation and there will be no need to hold an election for that position.

CAN A NOMINATION BE WITHDRAWN AFTER IT HAS BEEN FILED? If there are more nominations received than vacancies, a candidate may withdraw his/her nomination papers until 12:00 noon on the day following Nomination Day.

WHAT HAPPENS IF THERE AREN'T ENOUGH NOMINATIONS RECEIVED? The Returning Officer will hold another Nomination Day the following day from 10:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon and shall continue to do so for a period of six days or until sufficient nominations are received. If sufficient nominations are not received after the sixth day, the Minister of Municipal Affairs will be notified.

The third in the series of articles about the municipal election process will appear in the September issue of the Town News.

BYLAW ENFORCEMENT

Dear Residents,

I would like to inform and/or remind residents about the Town of Coalhurst's Bylaw #116-86 the "The Weed Control Bylaw", which states that "an individual is responsible for the removal of restricted, noxious, or nuisance weeds on their property and from their property line to the centre of the lane." Residents are required to control weeds from infestation onto neighboring lawns, to protect against fire hazards, and to also adhere to the Town of Coalhurst Bylaw #303-04 "Unsightly Premises Bylaw". Section 3, Sub-Section (a) of the "Unsightly Premises Bylaw" states that "no owner or occupant of premises shall cause or maintain his premises as an unsightly premise as defined in this By-Law."

In respect of your neighbors and the overall quality of life in this great Town of Coalhurst please take note of the above and ensure that your property is maintained to the above standards. If your property is in need of attention/maintenance please cut, mow, trim,

and/or remove any grass and/or weeds on your property, on any boulevard(s) adjacent to your property, and along your fence/property line in the alley behind your home, thank you in advance. Feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns you may have.
