MESSAGE FROM MAYOR DENNIS CASSIE - CONCERNS ON SAFETY FOR HIGHWAY 3 INTERSECTION

The Town of Coalhurst, Mayor and Council, continue to share in the concerns our residents hold regarding the safety of turning east on highway 3. Over the past few years Mayor and Council have held minimally 27 meetings that involved the County of Lethbridge, Ministry of Transportation, Ministry of Municipal Affairs, Ministry of Public Safety, Members of of Parliament, Members the Legislative Assembly, Mayors and Reeves of Southern Alberta and engineering firms to find a solution that increases safety for our residents and provides meaningful alternate routes to exit and enter Coalhurst. In addition to meetings a series of letters outlining the concerns have been sent to our MP, MLA's (Little Bow, Lethbridge East

and West), Premier of Alberta, Ministers responsible for Public Safety, Transportation and Municipal Affairs in an effort to not only outline the concerns but to provide proposals for increasing safety. Discussions have centred on: reduction of speed limit from 110 to 70 km/h on Highway No. 3, repositioning of the west bound deceleration lane, special funding assistance for the alternate access road, land acquisition to construct alternate road and funding for building of the access road. The Mayor and Council are committed to fighting for the Town's safety. We will not stop until an alternative safe route is in place that not only addresses the safety and congestion of traffic but supports the viability of the Town.

ELECTIONS '13

This is the third in a four-part series of articles dealing with this year's municipal election. This month we are dealing with Election Day and you as a voter.

WHAT NOTICE IS REQUIRED FOR ELECTION DAY? Notice will be published twice in the Lethbridge Herald, the first time during the week of October 6th and the second time during the week of October 13th, in the Town News and on the Town's website, as well as being posted at the Town Office. The notice will indicate where the polling station is, the times it will be open and the identification as required by the Local Authorities Election Act.

HOW DO I KNOW I AM ELIGIBLE TO VOTE?

If you are 18 years of age, a Canadian citizen; have resided in Alberta for the six consecutive months immediately preceding Election Day, are a resident of the Town on Election Day, have acceptable voter identification and sign a statement that you meet these qualifications, you are eligible to vote in the Town Election.

Ballots can be cast at the Community Centre (Ron Coombes Room) on Election Day (Monday, October 21) from 10:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. Upon entering the voting station report to the Deputy Returning Officer who will ask you to produce the required identification and make a statement, in the prescribed form, indicating that you are eligible to vote. You will be given your ballots and instructed to step into one of the voting compartments so you can vote in private. You have one vote for Mayor and may vote for up to four candidates for Councillor. You may also have a ballot for Palliser Regional Schools. After you have marked your ballots give them to the appropriate Deputy Returning Officer for deposit into the ballot box.

VOTER ELIGIBILITY IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS -WHAT KINDS OF ELECTOR IDENTIFICATION ARE VALID FOR PROVING ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE?

a. Forms of authorized identification for verification of a person's identity and

- residence include:(A) one piece of photo identification with name and address that is issued by a Canadian government (federal, provincial, local, or an agency thereof), or (B) one piece of identification authorized by the Chief Electoral Officer under the Election Act with name and address.
- b. Types of government –issued identification allowed under (A) must show the name, address and a photo of the elector and so examples of appropriate ID include:
 - i. Operator/Driver's license
 - ii. Government photo identification card (for non-drivers)
- c. Types of Chief Electoral Officer-approved identification allowed under (B) must show the name and address of the elector and so examples of appropriate ID include:
 - i. Attestation of Identity and Residence issued by the authorized representative of a correctional institution;
 - ii. Attestation of Identity and Residence issued by the authorized representative of a shelter or soup kitchen.
 - iii. Attestation of Residence issued by the authorized representative (landlord) of a commercial property management company;
 - iv. Attestation of Residence issued by the responsible authority of a Supportive Living Facility;
 - v. Bank/Credit card statement or personal cheque;
 - vi. Correspondence issued by a school, college or university;
 - vii. Government cheque or cheque hub;
 - viii. Income/property tax assessment notice;
 - ix. Insurance policy or coverage card;
 - x. Letter from a public curator, public guardian or public trustee;
 - xi. One of the following, issued by the responsible authority of a shelter or soup kitchen:
 - Attestation of residence, letter of stay, admission form or statement of benefits:
 - xii. Pension Plan statement of benefits, contributions or participation;

- xiii. Residential lease or mortgage statement;
- xiv. Statement of government benefits, e.g. employment insurance, old-age security, social assistance, disability support or child tax benefit:
- xv. Utility bill, e.g. telephone, public utilities commission, television, hydro, gas or water; and
- xvi. Vehicle ownership or insurance certificate.

HOW SHOULD I MARK MY BALLOT? With an "X" on the right hand side of the ballot opposite the name of the candidate(s) you have chosen to vote for.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T WANT TO VOTE FOR FOUR CANDIDATES FOR COUNCILLOR? You are allowed to vote for up to 4 candidates for Councillor. A ballot showing less than four "x" marks will be accepted. But don't mark more than four; that will be a spoiled ballot and will not be counted.

WILL THERE BE AN ADVANCE VOTE? OR AN INCAPACITATED VOTER VOTE? An Advance Vote has been arranged for the convenience of voters who expect to be absent from the Town on Election Day. Notice for the Advance Vote will be advertised in the Lethbridge Herald, the Town News, the Town's website and at the Town Office. The Advance Vote will be held Thursday, October 17th from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Town Office. If you are incapacitated, arrangements can be made to bring a voting station to your home. Please call the Town Office no later than 4:30 p.m., Wednesday. October 16th to make the necessary arrangements.

BYLAW ENFORCEMENT

Due to the fact that I have been

frequently dealing with the following issue I would like to remind residents about the Town of Coalhurst Bylaw #313-06, PART 12, SECTION 1201(c) which states that "Every person shall be guilty of an offence who places or deposits, or allows the placement or deposit, of any object, refuse, building or other materials, dumpsters, snow, earth, sand, gravel, sod, or any other matter on a roadway, alley, sidewalk, or boulevard within the Town, excepting vehicles and materials for which specific permission has been granted by the CAO."

I would also like to remind/inform residents about a frequently occurring problem that has been brought to my attention on several occasions. It has been reported to me that people are dumping their garbage, refuse, waste, etc. onto other privately owned lots/properties. This is unacceptable and those responsible may be charged by the RCMP for committing such an offence. I would suggest that Town of Coalhurst residents report any suspicious dumping of garbage, refuse, waste, etc. onto empty lots/properties to the RCMP by calling their regular complaint line at 403-329-5010.

In respect of your neighbors and the overall quality of life in this great Town of Coalhurst please take note of the above rules/regulations. If you are currently in violation of the above bylaw please take the appropriate and immediate action towards this matter, thank you in advance. Feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns you may have.


