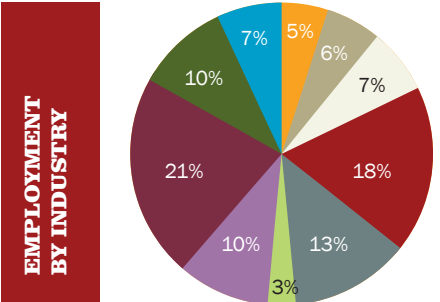

Originally established as a coal mining community, Coalhurst's current economic base is agriculture. It is located very near to a number of food processing facilities in the City of Lethbridge and the Town of Taber.

Coalhurst has a vibrant construction sector which includes a cedar retail outlet, a cabinet manufacturer, woodworker, and roofers. Coalhurst also has a directional drilling company. Services available locally include: restaurant, gasoline/convenience stores, floral design, car wash, computer software instruction, various trades, picture framing, barber shop, beauty salons, self-storage, taxidermy, DJs, landscaping and a branch of the Canadian Legion.

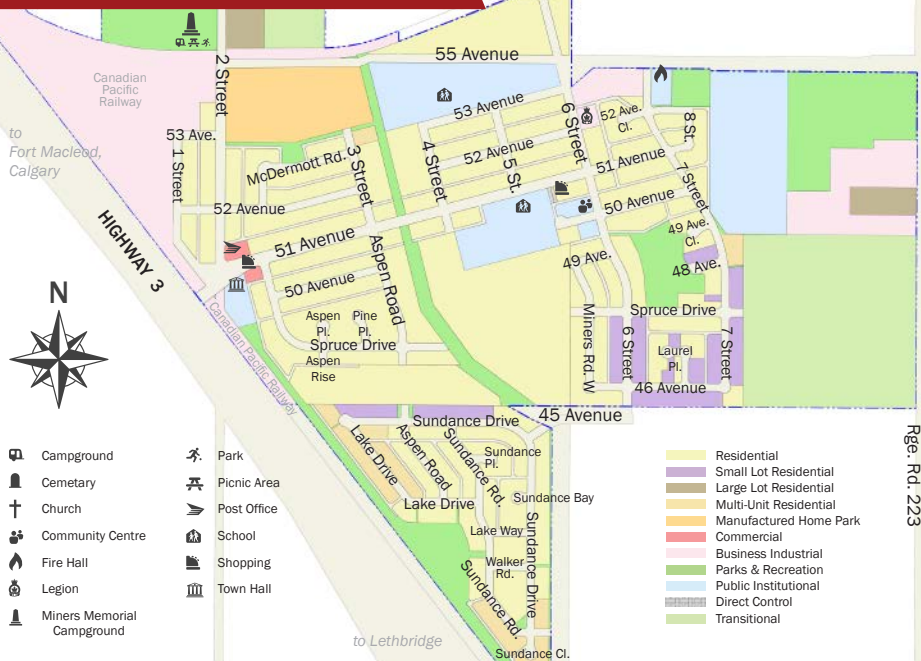

RECREATION



COALHURST AND DISTRICT COMMUNITY CENTRE

The Town boasts of the newest, most modern Community Centre in Southern Alberta. This building was built largely by volunteers from the community, and they can be proud of the work they did. The Centre consists of a main hall and stage area, a smaller self-contained room and a general meeting room.

With facilities for wedding receptions, showers, anniversaries, birthdays, dances, meetings, and other social functions, the Coalhurst and District Community Centre makes an ideal venue for many different types of functions. Private bookings are taken for weddings, family reunions, parties, meetings, etc. It is located at 527 – 50 Avenue.

DAVID A. VERES SOCIAL AREA

The Town of Coalhurst offers a large enclosed social area that can be rented for social functions. It includes a covered kitchen equipped with a fridge, stove, gas BBQs, and picnic tables. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is permitted at the facility in accordance with Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission laws.

BASEBALL DIAMONDS

There are four baseball diamonds located adjacent to the social area. They can be booked for individual games and tournaments.

SOCCER FIELDS

Miners Memorial Park has three soccer fields available for rent, located west of the ball diamonds.

CAMPGROUND

Overnight camping is available at a charge of \$20.00 per night (self registration at the campground). The campground contains a wide range of amenities including, group camping, pay showers, picnic shelter, sani station and flush toilets. There are 14 camping stalls available. Camping stalls are available on a first-come-first-served basis.

MINERS MEMORIAL PARK

A 23-acre, multi-use, year-round facility with 4 ball diamonds; 3 soccer fields; 14 camping stalls (un-serviced) with toilets, showers and R.V. dumping station; toboggan hill; outdoor skating rink (paved); children's playground; and 32,000-square-foot, fenced-in area for private social functions, including a covered eating area, B.B.Q. and kitchen with sink, stove and fridge.

KRAHN TOT PARK

A neighbourhood park with children's playground equipment.

IMPERIAL MEADOWS PARK

A five-acre green space with children's playground equipment, and a paved, lit walking trail.

SUNDANCE RIDGE PARK

A new neighbourhood park with a walking path, gazebo and lake. For more information on Sundance Ridge Developments go to www.sundancecommunity.ca.

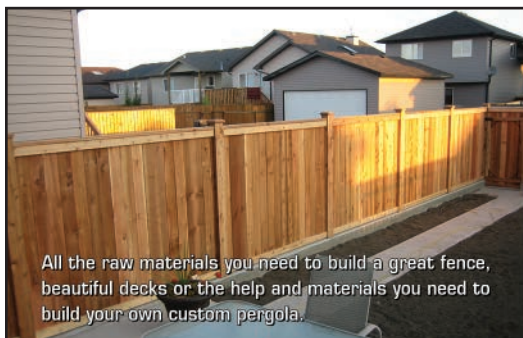

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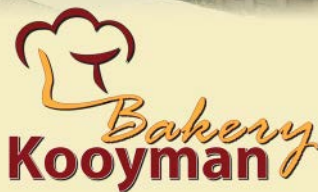


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
