

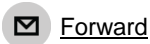

Mayor Willett goes to Edmonton

Every year SouthGrow attends a meeting in Edmonton alongside our colleagues from the nine Regional Economic Development Alliances of Alberta to report to our partners in the Government of Alberta. This year, Chairperson Jim Willett and Executive Director Peter Casurella joined the others in meeting with the Minister of Economic Development and Trade (Derron Bilous) to discuss the next renewal of the REDA partnership agreement in the spring of 2020.

Under the current model, the REDAs are a collaborative initiative between the Government of Alberta and groups of regional municipalities. The GOA contributes a set dollar amount per year towards the operating budgets of the organizations, with a mandated matching amount required from the municipal partners. The current agreement expires in the spring of 2020.

Mayor Willett and his fellow Chairs presented the Minister with a proposal for a renewed agreement that would see a small increase to the operational funding, matched by a corresponding increase from the municipal partners. The proposal also included a request for annual project money, similar to the REDA-specific CARES funding levels that have delivered so much value since they were instituted in 2016.

The ministry has promised to seriously consider the proposal in the months ahead, but no decision is likely to be forthcoming until well after the spring election has run its course.

Mayor Willett and staff also met with key partners, including Jason Price and Dale Chrapko from Ag and Forestry, (administrators in charge of the On Farm Energy and Solar PVP program that we deliver) Dee Pannu (Director of Investment Attraction from Ag and Forestry, and a key ally in our work to promote plant proteins in southern Alberta), and Tom Mansfield and Tammy Powell (administrators who help support regional work in Economic Development & Trade).

Our conversations affirmed that SouthGrow is on the right track, and that there is a growing awareness in Edmonton of the work we are engaged in. With that awareness comes an interest in partnering on and supporting the projects that we are pursuing that we intend to leverage for the benefit of both the municipalities and the GOA.

SouthGrow, after all, is a partnership between the municipalities and the Government of Alberta, and so our successes are their successes as well. With the strength of our collaboration and the growing economic success that so much of our region is experiencing, its hard to envision a future in which our largest stakeholder does not re-invest. Mayor Willett and the rest of the SouthGrow team will certainly keep working to make sure that all of our stakeholders understand the value that SouthGrow brings to the provincial equation so that our collaboration with the Province will continue well beyond 2020.

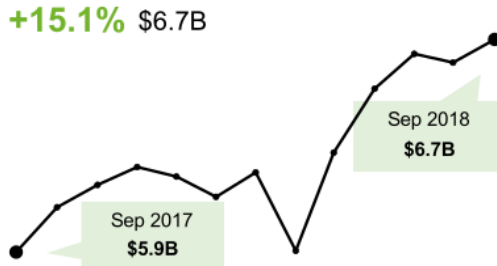

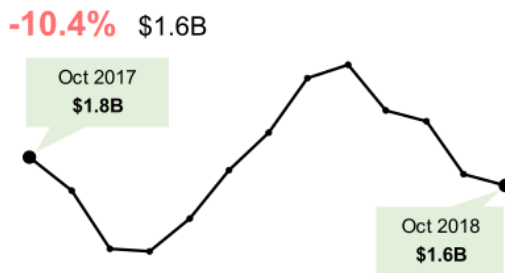
Indicators Updated this Week

Manufacturing Sales



In September 2018, the value of Alberta's manufacturing sales increased 15.1% compared with September 2017, to \$6.7 billion. In Alberta, petroleum and coal products led the growth, increasing by 31.8%. Fabricated metal products was the only industry that saw a decrease, declining 2.7%.

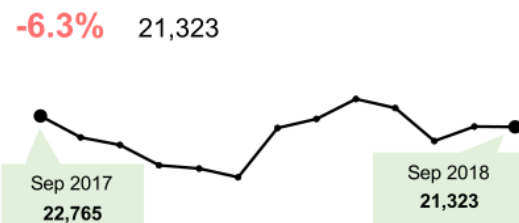
MLS Sales



The dollar volume of homes sold in Alberta through the Multiple Listing Service (MLS) decreased 10.4% to \$1.59 billion in October 2018 compared to the same time period a year earlier. Nationally, total sales values were down 5.2%, with British Columbia posting the largest decrease (-29.2%). Quebec saw the largest year over year increase in sales volume, increasing 16.4% to \$2.23 billion.

In Alberta, Grande Prairie (+31.6%), Lethbridge (+19.1%), and Fort McMurray (+13.5%) were the only municipalities to see a year-over-year increase. Red Deer had the largest drop year-over-year in the province (-15.4%).

Motor Vehicle Sales

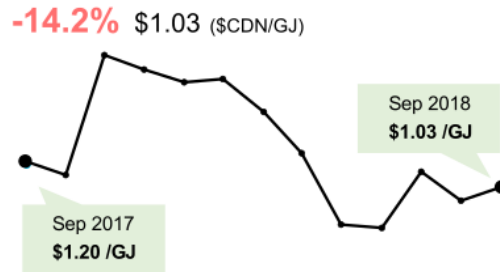


The number of new motor vehicles sold in Alberta decreased by 6.3% between September 2017 and September 2018 to 21,323, while the number of motor vehicles sold in Canada decreased by 6.7% over the same period.

Sales of passenger vehicles decreased 17.0% year-over-year, while sales of trucks (including

minivans, SUVs, light and heavy trucks, vans, and buses) decreased by 4.2%. In September 2018 trucks comprised 85.0% of all vehicle sales.

Natural Gas Price



The price of natural gas in September 2018 was CDN\$1.03 per gigajoule, down 14.2% from September 2017.

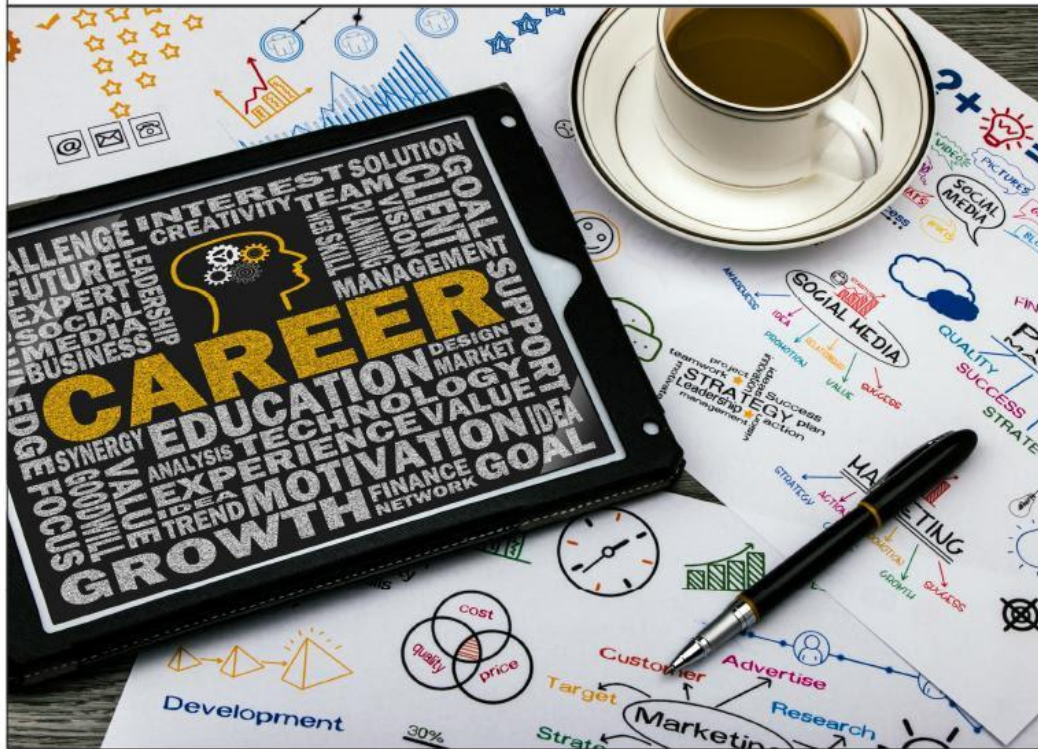
