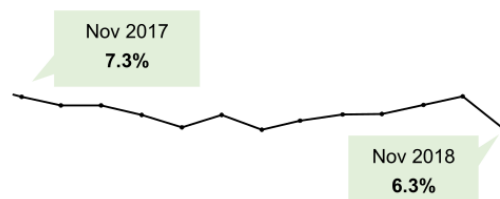

Indicators Updated this Week

Unemployment Rate

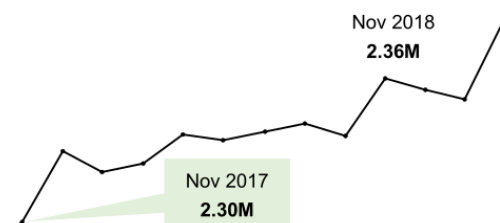
-1.0% 6.3%



In November 2018 Alberta's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 6.3%, down from the 7.3% rate that was registered a year earlier and down from last month's 7.3% rate. The national unemployment rate was 5.6% in November, down from last November's rate of 5.9%.

Employment

+2.6% 2.36M



Total employment in Alberta increased by 23,700 jobs between October 2018 and November 2018. On a year-over-year basis, employment grew by 58,900 jobs or 2.6% in November. Over the same period, Canada's employment increased by 1.2% or by 218,800 jobs. Full-time employment increased by 4.2% in Alberta, while part-time employment decreased by 4.9% on a year-over-year basis.

Merchandise Exports

+28.3% \$10.8B



Alberta's international merchandise exports were \$10.8 billion in October 2018, 28.3% higher than the same period last year. Canadian exports increased 13.1% over the same period. In Alberta, all export categories increased except Farm, fishing and intermediate food products. Exports of industrial machinery increased 57.7% year-over-year, the most of any product category.

Oil Production

+17.8% 18.1M m³



Oil production in Alberta was 18.05 million cubic metres in October 2018, up 17.8% compared to October 2017.

Non-conventional (or oil sands) production constituted 83.4% of all oil production in Alberta in October 2018. Production of non-conventional oil was up 18.3% while conventional oil production increased by 15.1% on a year-over-year basis.

Natural Gas Production

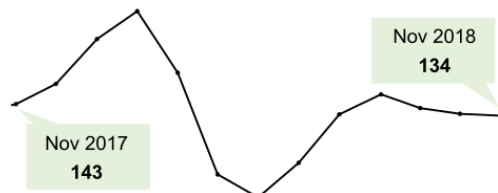
+0.0% 9.1B m³



In October 2018, marketable natural gas production reached 9.1 billion cubic metres, a negligible increase from October 2017's production level.

Active Drilling Rigs

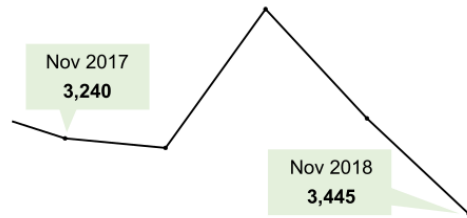
-6.3% 134



The average number of active drilling rigs in November 2018 was 134, decreasing by 9 (-6.3%) from November 2017. The number of inactive rigs decreased 5.6% from 288 to 272 over the same period.

Incorporations

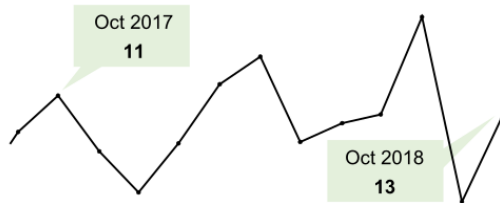
+6.3% 3,445



In November 2018, the number of businesses incorporated in Alberta totalled 3,445, an increase of 6.3% from the same period a year earlier. Alberta incorporations were up 5.8% to 3,073, while non-Alberta incorporations increased 11.0% from a year earlier to 372.

Bankruptcies

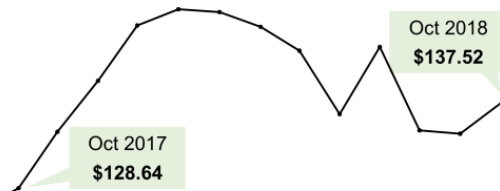
+18.2% 13



Alberta business bankruptcies increased 18.2% from 11 in October 2017 to 13 in October 2018. Consumer bankruptcies in Alberta decreased by 0.7% from 450 in October 2017, to 447 in October 2018.

Cattle Price

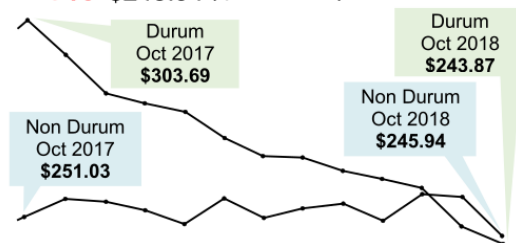
+6.9% \$137.52 (\$/hundredweight)



Cattle prices in Alberta increased by 6.9% in October 2018 compared to the same time period a year earlier, to \$137.52 per hundredweight, the highest price in Canada. Calve prices increased by 1.0% year-over-year in October 2018 to \$180.35. Hog prices increased by 12.3% in October 2018 compared to the same period a year earlier, to \$72.93.

Wheat Price

-2.0% \$245.94 (\$/metric tonne)

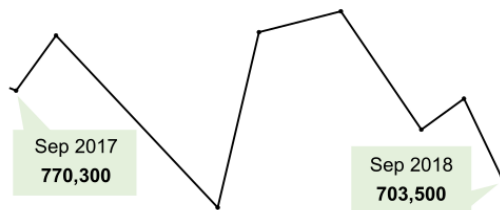


In October 2018, Alberta non-durum wheat prices, which include the weighted average prices of milling and other wheat excluding durum, were \$245.94/metric tonne, 2.0% lower than prices in October 2017.

Durum wheat prices in October 2018 were \$243.87/metric tonne, 19.7% lower than October 2017.

Lumber Production

-8.7% 703,500 m³



Lumber production in Alberta was down 8.7% year-over-year in September 2018 to 703,500 cubic metres. Alberta lumber shipments decreased 4.1% to 725,300 cubic metres in September 2018 compared to September 2017. Nationally, lumber shipments decreased by 6.0% to 5.4 million cubic metres when compared with the same period.

Apply Now for the Alberta Municipal Solar Program

The [Municipal Climate Change Action Centre \(MCCAC\)](#) is pleased to announce an extension of funding and updates to the [Alberta Municipal Solar Program \(AMSP\)](#). Thanks to additional funding from the Government of Alberta, municipalities who have not yet had a chance to participate in this exciting program can still apply.

Highlights of the updated AMSP:

- The maximum eligible rebate per project has increased from 25 percent to 30 percent of eligible expenses.
- A first-time applicant bonus rebate of \$0.25/watt is available to municipalities that have not previously participated in the AMSP for their first project.
- AMSP funding is available on a first come, first served basis and municipalities are eligible to submit multiple applications.

Any municipality that has already received an incentive through the AMSP for a completed project or has signed an AMSP Implementation Funding Agreement for a project under construction is not eligible for the first-time applicant bonus.
