CANADA RECOVERY HIRING PROGRAM (CRHP) CANADA EMERGENCY WAGE SUBSIDY(CEWS)	 The government is proposing to extend the Canada Recovery Hiring Program until May 7, 2022, for eligible employers with current revenue osses above 10% and to increase the subsidy rate to 50%. The government is proposing targeted support for eligible hard-hit employers until March 13, 2022. This support would be available through two new streams: The Tourism and Hospitality Recovery Program, which would provide support to businesses like hotels, tour operators, travel agencies and restaurants, with a subsidy rate of up to 75%. The Hardest-Hit Business Recovery Program, which would support other hard-hit businesses, with a subsidy rate of up to 50%. From March 13, 2022, to May 7, 2022, the subsidy rates will decrease by half.
