It's hard to believe that December is upon us ... although the bitterly cold temperatures and snow are probably a clue! This time of the year, I start reflecting on the previous 11 months, and planning for the next 12. Things may look different in the Office than when the year began, but we are all here to serve our residents at the highest possible level.

This has been a year of change for the Town but as we end 2022, staff are filled with optimism for the year to come. In 2023, we will continue to serve Council and the community to achieve our collective goals, especially as we execute Council's Strategic Plan. Meanwhile, your Council will continue to work towards envisioning a bright, prosperous future for Coalhurst.

As for the recent activities of Town Hall:

Budget deliberations:

On December 6th, Council will deliberate the 2023 Operating and Capital budgets. Members have led several budget conversations over the past two months, and they have worked hard to minimize costs while improving some services levels. I'd like to recognize Mike, our Director of Corporate Services, for his hours of work in preparation of the budget, and for his tenacity in finding operating and capital savings. Additionally, all staff are looking at how they do their work and working to implement the efficiencies they find.

Event attendance:

Aside from my usual Council and Committee attendance, I attended the Staff and Community Leaders Appreciation Dinner on November 26th. What a wonderful way to gather 'community' and celebrate our staff and the many volunteers who make Coalhurst a special place! Thank you to everyone involved in the evening – great MC job, Deputy Mayor Potrie and Cllr Florence! – and to Ashley for her work in putting it all together.

Wetlands project:

As you may have guessed, November's wet weather and the current cold snap has made hydroseeding the Wetlands impossible. This work will have to be completed in early 2023. Otherwise, the rest of this phase is complete (on time and under budget), and we have a working, functional drainage system in place with the ponds naturally filtering the water before it is moved into the Oldman River. We will begin planning Phase 3 – connecting the Wetlands to other parts of the town – in the new year.

Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) hiring:

November 30th was the closing date for CAO applications. Council received 44 résumés from across Canada, with most having relevant experiences and desired skills. Over the next few weeks, Council will review the CVs and narrow the selection to a medium list of candidates for a first round of interviews. Shortlist interviews ought to begin in early January with the goal of having a new CAO in place for the start of February. The sooner we have a permanent CAO in the position, the better it will be for the community, Council, and staff.

Speed data:

The second digital speed sign will be up and operating next week. While these signs are about driver awareness, they collect traffic movement data that our Community Peace Officer and the RCMP use for targeted traffic enforcement. This is another tool we use to help keep our residents safe.

Community Peace Officer (CPO) Update:

On December 5th, we will submit our application to Alberta Justice, for them to appoint John as our CPO. John has completed all his (re)qualifications and he is anxious to be out, in support of the community. In the meantime, he has been reviewing and re-drafting some of our bylaws – most recently our Animal Control Bylaw - to bring them to current best practices and standards. John participates on the Policy/Bylaw and Risk Review Committee, and he contributes his knowledge and experience to the discussions. Alberta Recycling Management Authority (ARMA):

At the end of October, our Director of Operations (Kevin) entered an ARMA contest, for one of 25 100% recycled plastic benches. We won a bench! The bench must be installed in a publicly accessible space and be in place by September 30th 2023. Keep an eye out for it in one of our wonderful park spaces, next spring!

Municipal training:



It's important that staff remain informed and engaged on the many facets of local government and these remote sessions are an easy way to accomplish this goal. During the first week of December, everyone will be participating in an interactive workshop on "bias."


