CAO Report: April 2023

March may have gone "out like a lamb," but April came in like a cheetah ... and kept running all month. April saw Town operations - public works and office staff - busy with cleaning up, preparing, planning, transitioning, renovating, and working to meet community needs. Here is some of what was going on:

New CAO, Shawn Patience

Shawn was in the office several times, over the month. He has met all staff and is getting the 'lay of the land.' We have been bringing him up to speed on Town activities, and he has provided sage advice and guidance on several matters.

He also came to the office to conduct interviews for the positions of Coordinator of Community Development and Development Officer, respectively. I am pleased to report that we had quality applicants for both positions.

Coordinator of Community Development.

As mentioned above, Shawn and I interviewed three stellar candidates for the position of Coordinator of Community Development. An offer letter was extended to one candidate, who has agreed to take on this significant role. This individual will begin on May 15th. CAO Patience will introduce you to her.

Public Works in Springtime

Part of the April blur comes from Public Works' transition from Winter into Spring (snow fences down, parks and park amenity condition assessments, road repairs, plows away and mowers prepped, etc). This transition supported a disc golf event, and the arrival of the 2023 Coulee Kickers Soccer Association season. While we were able to support the CKSA requirements with a roll-out of available fields, the long (long ... long) winter left grounds frozen and inaccessible for our clean up machinery. However, I would like to thank the CKSA volunteers who spent time on Easter weekend *manually* raking two fields in preparation for the beginning of the season. Fortunately, Spring *has* arrived and at the time of this writing, all the fields are clear of debris, mowed and ready for another great summer season of soccer, baseball and general play and enjoyment of our great amenities. Thank you to our Parks staff for the great work!

A note on mowing

Mowing of fields and parks is completed when there is a need to mow. A lot of rain and sunshine means that a field can require two mows in one week. A dry spell means that grass does not grow at a rapid pace so – to efficiently and effectively allocate limited resources – Public Works may leave a field or park until mowing makes sense. We don't mow a field or park if it doesn't meet the requirement to mow it.

We do monitor growth and conditions in all our parks and sports fields, and we do commit to tending to them at the appropriate and necessary time.

New office ... kind of ...

We have undertaken some renovations to the office, to accommodate one new position (Coordinator of Community Development). The construction was completed in about 2 weeks, and we have redesigned spaces for the CAO, the Director of Corporate Services, the Coordinator of Legislative Services and for our (future) Development Officer (DO). The office for the DO is accessible from the lobby since people come in for permits and development questions. Once we have a DO in place, s/he will have a unique office set up dedicated to helping residents and businesses achieve their goals.

Professional Administrator's Day

There are people in our lives who keep things running, and we don't take the time to say "thank you" for their on-going support. On Wednesday April 26th, staff gathered to acknowledge the contributions to our office and our work, of Ashley and Cathi. *Someone* has to answer the phone, assist with resident requests, take payments, check accounts ... basically undertake the daily and "routine" work of the municipality and these two women do just that. Ashley is our front-line and the forward face of the office, with Cathi providing the back up and support. Without these two ... residents would be looking at my perplexed expression as I fumble my way through questions and unsuccessfully seek answers. As incoming CAO Patience says, "we win or lose together as a team" and Ashley and Cathi are valuable teammates who contribute in ongoing, often unappreciated ways.

I'd like to extend a special "thank you" to Ashley who has been an invaluable assistance to me, by undertaking the things with which I needed support (there was a lot!) or with which I needed context, advise or input (there was a lot of that too!). Thank you, Ashley!

Spring Clean Up

Spring Clean Up is coming and this seems to be one of those events that has seen a slow creep away from the "acceptable" conditions around what waste we collect, piles in alleys, debris not collected that remains in an alley, et cetera. Residents can support the program by continuing to put small waste into the regular collection bins, and can do so year-round. If items fit into your regular bin, please use that for disposal. Again ... year-round. To accompany this year's program, our CPO will be monitoring alleys pre and post collection, enforcing our bylaws when required.

Thank you!

The past six months have been an incredible journey. There are two things I'd like to share. Staff: In my studies of municipal organization, two recurring issues - "lack of municipal innovation" and "poor work culture" - constantly appear as barriers to accomplishment. Please recognize that you have a compliment of employees incredibly dedicated to the success of the community. Your work force is innovative, creative and they embrace the *good* habits of a healthy work culture. Each day is filled with equal doses of silent work, problem sharing and solving, and laughter. There is a mutual respect for each other and everyone carries core competencies. You have employees and an Organization to be celebrated! Council: While there are councils who put the "fun" in "dysfunctional," your Council works well together: differences are respected, patience is exhibited, and the desire to move collectively is at the forefront. Respectful disagreement is a core element of a Democracy and Council exercises that with great care.

While I'm happy to have served and happy to step aside for Shawn's leadership as CAO, I am sad that I won't be part of the amazing, incredible things that Council and staff are going to accomplish during the rest of this term ... and beyond. I firmly believe that Coalhurst will achieve many successes!

Thank you to everyone who reached out and offered support and encouragement, during my time here. It has been my pleasure to serve Council and this community!

Coalhurst Reuse Weekend May 19, 20, 21

On May 19, 20, and 21 residents are invited to take this opportunity to clear out unusable, unwanted items that are taking up space in their homes.

Residents can place any items that are suitable to reuse on their property in front of their house on Friday evening and mark them with a FREE sign or sticker. Over the weekend, people are invited to cruise the streets and help themselves to any of the goodies, free of charge. The event is over on Sunday evening at 7:00 p.m. Anything remaining after 7:00 p.m. Sunday, May 21st must be taken back in by the owner. For more information call the Town Office at 403-381-3033.

Examples of giveaway items can include:

- books, CDs, and DVDs
- furniture, electronics and small appliances
- sports equipment and toys
- kitchen gadgets, dishes, cutlery, pots, and pans
- unwanted gifts
- clothing

Give away etiquette: Respect other people's property, belongings, and traffic laws. Consider the safety of items left out for reuse and consult the Consumer Product Safety Bureau if unsure.

The Town of Coalhurst hopes residents will take part and enjoy a weekend perusing through the neighbourhoods in search of new-to-you treasures! This weekend will coincide with **Spring Clean Up, being held May 24th**, to help cut down expenses. (Watch for spring clean up details in Town News and on web site.)









Spring Clean-up

The intent of spring clean-up is to allow residents to dispose of yard waste, branches, and large items. We ask that residents use their garbage carts for regular bagged waste throughout the year to help reduce trucking and loader clean-up costs. Up to \$8,000 could be saved if we reduce regular garbage from spring clean-up.

Piles of loose debris will not be picked up.

You must have all of you Items out by 8:00 AM May 25th. Please do not put items out before May 18th. Items placed out after that time will be the responsibility of the homeowner/resident.

Items that will be collected:

Tree branches: stack neatly in one direction as to not impede traffic in the lane. Please bundle small branches with string. No branches over 6 ft in length. **Place branches in a separate pile** as they are picked up at a different time.

Bagged yard waste

Furniture and mattresses

Appliances: All appliances that **do not** contain freon. No refrigerators/ freezers **Metal Items:** Bikes, BBQs, other metal items **place in a separate pile** as metal is recycled and picked up at a different time.

Electronics: Place in a separate pile as these items are picked up at a different time.

We will not collect:

Renovation or Construction Material
Dirt, rocks, concrete, bricks, sod
Roofing Materials (shingles)
Paints, solvents, chemicals, oils, antifreeze
Car parts or car bodies
Drywall
Refrigerator, freezers, A/C units or other items containing freon gas




