


MINERS DAYS WEEKEND



We love our spray park! With warmer days ahead, we look forward to hearing the sounds of happy children cooling off in our world-class spray park.

A reminder about the Spray Park Rules to keep every safe this summer season:

- Spray parks are intended for children 12 years and under
- Adult supervision is mandatory
- Running and rough play is prohibited
- No pets, glass bottles, rocks, or foreign objects are permitted in the area
- Do not swing, climb, hand or pull on any equipment
- Swim diapers are required for non-toiled trained children
- · Do not drink the splash pad water
- No food or drinks permitted in the area
- Exit the splash pad immediately if the pad is contaminated with blood, vomit, or fecal matter call 403-634-1627
- Exit the splash pad immediately and seek cover upon the first sign of thunder, lightning, or extreme weather
- For medical emergencies, call 9-1-1
- For any spray park maintenance or equipment issues call 403-634-1627
