NEWS FROM THE TOWN

SPRING IN COALHURST

It's a busy time throughout town as we all transition from winter to spring and get our homes and yards ready for the summer season. Over the last few weeks we've seen many residents start to clean up their yards, spruce up patio furniture and get their gardens ready for planting. With that, our Public Works crew has also been hard at work, clearing parks, ball diamonds and soccer fields of debris (and SO MANY tumbleweeds - the most we've seen in years!), prepping lawn maintenance equipment, and preparing for major annual activities such as street sweeping and the Spring Cleanup program.

We've received a few calls with questions about some of the annual spring programs, so here's a rundown of what you need to know to successfully take part.

STREET SWEEPING PROGRAM

Dates for the annual Street Sweeping Program are still being finalized so we don't have specific details to share yet, but keep an eye on the <u>Town's website</u>, <u>Facebook page</u> and billboards to find out when crews will be in the community. At this time, based on weather conditions and contractor availability, we anticipate the cleanup to happen toward the end of this month. When the time comes, please park off-street if possible so sweepers can clean as much roadway as possible.

SPRING CLEANUP PROGRAM

During this one-week program, you may place specified items along the fence in your rear alley, if you have one. If you do not have a rear alley, you may place items in the front of your property near your regular garbage pickup location. Materials must be placed no sooner than Wednesday, May 15, and no later than 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, May 22.

The intent of this program is to allow residents to dispose of large household items, bagged yard waste, and pruned branches. **The following items are accepted in the program.** (Please note items that need to be piled separately, as each type of material may be collected at different times.)

- Tree branches: Pile separately from all other material and stack neatly in one direction so traffic is not impeded in the lane. Bundle small branches with string. No branches over 6 ft in length.
- Bagged yard waste
- · Furniture and mattresses
- Appliances: Must <u>not</u> contain freon. No refrigerators or freezers.
- **Metal items:** Pile separately from all other material. May include bikes, BBQs, other metal items.
- Electronics: Pile separately from all other material.

Items NOT accepted for spring cleanup:

- Renovation or construction material
- Dirt, rocks, concrete, bricks, sod
- Roofing materials (shingles)
- Paints, solvents, chemicals, oils, antifreeze
- Car parts or car bodies
- Drywall
- Refrigerators, freezers, A/C units, or other items containing freon gas
- Piles of loose debris

Items placed after 8:00 a.m. on May 22 will be the responsibility of the homeowner/resident.



As residents prepare for the Spring Cleanup Program, please consider what you're placing curbside. If there are items that can fit inside your regular garbage cart, please use that option instead, which is available year-round. This is to help reduce trucking and loader cleanup costs associated with the spring program.



DOWNSPOUT EXTENSIONS

A few days of wet weather to end April and start May have been good reminders that it's time to check our downspouts and install/repair/replace our downspout extensions if they've been damaged or removed.

Putting an extension on your downspout can help mitigate the risks of water collecting near your home's foundation, entering your basement, or causing your sump pump to run more often (if you have a sump pump).

The Town of Coalhurst <u>Utility Bylaw #424-21</u> says extensions must be installed on downspouts to a minimum of 1.8m (6ft).

COMMUNITY GARDEN COMING SOON

We're looking forward to the opening of Coalhurst's new community garden in Miners Memorial Park in the coming weeks. The garden will be located near the playground and social area and will include 12 raised garden beds that will be accessible to community members.

Thoughtful consideration has been given to the location of the garden based on ease of access and safety for gardeners, parking availability, appropriate access to water, community impact, and sustainability of the program.

Details of the Community Garden Program are being finalized, so as soon as the garden site is complete and the program is ready to roll out, we will announce details on the Town's website and Facebook page. Please look there for updates.

As we work through the first year of this new program, we will also be looking for feedback from community members so we can continue to make improvements for the 2025 growing season, to offer an excellent outdoor recreation and community-building opportunity for residents each summer.



DROUGHT UPDATE

Speaking of gardens and outdoor landscaping activities, it's prudent we all take a close look at the current drought conditions and what steps we may need to take as a community in response to a very dry year.

The Town of Coalhurst is working closely with the Province of Alberta and its regional partners to monitor water levels and consider what steps we may need to take to reduce water consumption while maintaining public safety.

The Town and many of its municipal neighbours are following the same plan as the <u>City of Lethbridge</u>. As of May 1, there are no water restrictions in Coalhurst. However, all residents are asked to voluntarily reduce their water consumption as best as possible, implementing appropriate water conservation efforts such as taking shorter showers, only running full loads of laundry and dishes, and minimizing outdoor water use.

Seasonal water levels in surrounding reservoirs remain extremely low, which means there is a possibility that mandatory water restrictions will be required. If this happens, Coalhurst will implement the same water restrictions used in Lethbridge, which may impact the amount of water residents can use for watering lawns, trees and shrubs, when watering will be allowed, and whether outdoor pools, ponds and hot tubs can be used.

As we navigate the changing conditions, please stay tuned to municipal websites and local media to know if or when water rationing actions may be required and implemented. We all have a part to play in water conservation and we appreciate everyone's efforts to help. (Get Provincial updates at alberta.ca/drought.)




