STREET SWEEPING PROGRAM UPDATE

Due to an unexpected delay for our contractor, street sweeping in Coalhurst has been rescheduled to take place **Wednesday**, **June 5 and Thursday**, **June 6, 2024.** On those dates, please be sure to park your vehicle(s) off-street, if possible, to allow crews to clean as much of the roadway as possible.



SPRAY PARK IS OPEN!

We are pleased to announce the Coalhurst Spray Park has opened for the season. We know many people love to visit the spray park to enjoy time outside and cool off a bit during the hot summer season. We're excited to see people enjoy this space again this year, with slightly modified operations in response to the ongoing drought situation in southern Alberta.

Although the spray park uses a recirculating water system, not all the water is able to be retained and reused. Therefore, as part of the Town's efforts to help conserve water and be responsible stewards of this important resource, the spray park will have reduced hours. It will be open 12 PM – 6 PM daily, weather permitting. These hours may be adjusted to fit community needs or if mandatory water restrictions are required. We encourage everyone to stay tuned to the Town's website and Facebook page for updates throughout the summer in case changes need to be made for hours of operation or availability.

COALHURST CAMPGROUND OPEN

Do you have family or friends coming to visit this summer but you need a little more room for everyone to stay overnight? Why not consider the Coalhurst campground!

Overnight camping is available at a charge of \$25.00 per night (self registration at the campground). The campground contains a wide range of amenities including pay showers, a picnic shelter, sani-station and flush toilets. There are 14 camping stalls available on a first-come, first-served basis.

The David A. Veres Social Area is also open for the season and available for booking. It includes a covered kitchen with a fridge, stove, gas BBQs, fireplace and picnic tables. If you're looking to book the social area, please email our facilities coordinator, Cathi, at cmccann@coalhurst.ca.



BEING PREPARED FOR EMERGENCIES

Emergencies can happen any time so we want to be prepared to respond. To help you stay safe in fast-moving events, it's important to know where to find up-to-date, reliable information quickly.

In the event we have a large-scale emergency in Coalhurst that requires evacuations or a shelter-inplace, the Town will distribute emergency information through the Alberta Emergency Alert (AEA) system. This province-wide system allows us to use a well-known, consistent source of information to get important details out to residents quickly. We will also provide that same information on the Town's website and social media channels.

We encourage everyone to download the AEA app on your mobile devices and 'follow' Coalhurst for alerts. You can download the AEA app on Apple and Android devices, free of charge.

We also encourage you to 'follow' neighbouring communities such as Lethbridge County, City of Lethbridge, Shaughnessy, Picture Butte, Nobleford, and beyond. That way, if something major happens within our region, we can be more prepared in case we also need to take action.

Don't have a mobile device? Talk to your neighbours and friends and ask them to help keep you informed if they receive an alert that requires action. Because working together helps all of us.
