SNOW MUCH FUN AT MINERS PARK

After an unseasonably warm and dry January, the cold winter weather we've been anticipating has finally arrived. Thanks to a drop in temperature, the Coalhurst Fire Department is flooding the outdoor skating rink.

It takes several days of very cold weather (about -20 C) and several inches of ice to make the surface usable so please stay off the ice until we let you know



it's ready. We'll post a notice on our website, LED billboard, and Facebook page when the rink is open.

A big thanks goes out to the Fire Department and the Town's Public Works Department for working to make this park amenity available. If you head out for a skate, please remember helmets are strongly encouraged.

SIDEWALKS, DRIVEWAYS AND GUTTERS... OH MY!

We're hopeful that February will bring more moisture in the form of snow and not just cold weather. If Old Man Winter does drop snow throughout the month, here are some quick reminders to help keep yourself and your family / friends / neighbours safe as we move about town.

KEEPING THINGS CLEAR

After a new snowfall, residents and business owners need to make sure the sidewalk adjacent to their property is cleared of snow and ice within 48 hours. We understand it can be a lot of work and some of that snow can be tough to move, but it's vital for keeping our community safe and accessible.

If you are a senior or someone with a mobility issue that makes it too difficult to shovel your driveway and/or sidewalk, we also want to make sure you're aware help is available through the FCSS Snow Angels program (check out the full page ad later in this newsletter).



KEEPING THINGS SAFE

If we do get snow and the temperature fluctuates, you might find the sidewalk outside your place becomes icy. If so, the Town provides winter sand (free of charge) that can be used for traction on sidewalks. There are

four (4) locations with sand boxes around town that can be accessed any time. These boxes are located at the following places (see yellow dots on the map below):

- Coalhurst Esso (201 51st Ave)
- Coalhurst recycling depot (702 55 Ave)
- Imperial Meadows Park (613 Spruce Drive)
- The south end of Sundance subdivision



KEEPING THINGS DRY

Finally, if we get snow followed by a big melt, we can sometimes find pooling along streets if grates and catch basins get covered. Town staff work diligently to keep these areas clear of snow but sometimes a fast melt can mean they get covered before we can get back to an area.

If you see slush and water pooling around these areas in your neighbourhood or if your road gutters are full, please consider clearing the slush and snow out of the way to help with drainage into the storm system.
